NEW BUSINESS:

Main Street

Grinding) President Munro commented to have the west side of the sidewalks done by PAB Concrete Cutting will cost \$1950.00. Trustee Fischer requested staff find out who the City of Genoa uses and get a bid from that company.

COMMENTS AND PETITIONS:

Trustee Fischer commented information was given to everyone with regard to local debit recovery. This is a new program which allows local governments to submit claims against people who owe debt to them. The state can deduct those sums from tax returns, lottery winnings, and state payments that the individuals are to receive. The village currently has four outstanding liens totaling over \$2,500.00 and ordinance violation tickets totally over \$1,000.00 that have remain unpaid. Consensus was expressed by the board to have Attorney Buick review the information.
