MEETING CALL:

The Regular Village Board Meeting with the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Kingston was called to order at 7:00 pm by President John Munro, November 1, 2010, in the Village Board Room, at the Kingston Municipal Building, 101 E. Railroad St., Kingston, DeKalb County, Illinois.

VILLAGE OFFICERS REPORT

Police  
Department

Chief Taft reported that the new computer that they received from a grant arrived.

Chief Taft reported that there was a complaint that trucks were jake braking at Glidden and Route 72. County Highway will be posting signs for no jake braking.

Chief Taft commented that the railroad crossing on North Main St. has temporarily been fixed.

Chief Taft commented that there were eleven car burglaries in River Oaks.

Chief Taft reported that the Road Closed signs on River Rd. are broken and no longer upright. President Munro commented that he will talk with Public Works about the issue. Attorney Buick will review his old notes about the road closure to confirm that the road was never formally vacated.

Attorney Buick commented that he received a phone call from an attorney, representing an individual who wants to purchase Lot 69 in the River Oaks subdivision. The lot is currently zoned P - Park. Attorney Buick shared the zoning code provisions with the attorney.

Attorney Buick commented that DCCF is offering a stormwater grant for \$5,000.00 that is due November 12th.

Attorney Buick commented that the election packets for the April election can be made available now. The petitions and related filing materials for the candidates must be returned between December 13th and December 20th.

Engineer Berry commented that he will assist in writing the DCCF stormwater grant.

Engineer Berry commented that IDOT will be offering a grant for 2012, that can be used for sidewalk replacement, utility pole relocation, etc. The

grant would cover 80 percent of the costs and the village would have to come up with the other 20 percent. The board is considering a beautification project in the business district.

Village Clerk Clerk Edwards reported that the village received the grant for the tornado siren. Clerk Edwards commented that the police department, fire department, and village will need to get together to discuss the activation of the siren. Attorney Buick will email Clerk Edwards the activation procedure that the Village of Malta/Kishwaukee College/DeKalb County Sheriff's Office use for their siren. Clerk Edwards will contact Jeff Rybe, with Braniff Communications, to have him attend the next meeting to discuss the siren.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

City of Genoa (Wastewater) Engineer Kevin Berry commented that the average flow for October was less than 60,000 PE. Engineer Berry will email Trustee Ruehl again with regard to the sewer letter.

Hunter Rd. Engineer Berry commented that Kingston Township started working on their portion of the road.

Employee Handbook President Munro commented that the date of the employees hiring was in their packets. President Munro suggested the board make a new policy only allowing a maximum of two or three weeks of vacation time. The board discussed changing December 1st of the new season to December 31st of the following season.

Treasurer Taunya Fischer commented that a safety fence will be going up along the sidewalk by the drainage swale. The fence supports will be

drilled into the sidewalk concrete. The board requested that ICCI be contacted with regard to the height of the fence and have Groundmasters provide proof of insurance.
